Tianyun International Holdings Limited (SEHK:6836)

Four Seas Mercantile Holdings Limited (SEHK:374)

374 has a nice dividend yield of 2.76% and pays 10.57% of it's earnings as dividends . 374's dividends have seen an increase over the past 10 years, with payments increasing from HK\$0.07 to HK\$0.095 in that time. Much to the delight of shareholders, the company has not missed a payment during this time. Four Seas Mercantile Holdings's earnings growth over the past 12 months has exceeded the hk food industry, with the company reporting an EPS growth of 768.01% while the industry totaled -3.70%. Alltronics Holdings Limited (SEHK:833)

833 has a good-sized dividend yield of 3.61% and their payout ratio stands at 66.78% . Although investors would have seen a few years of reduced payments, it has so far always picked up again, with dividends increasing from HK\$0.04 to HK\$0.089 over the past 10 years. Alltronics Holdings's performance over the last 12 months beat the hk consumer durables industry, with the company reporting 108.21% EPS growth compared to its industry's figure of 10.90%.
